



While this date is three months away, the planning is well underway. I know that you all want to participate so here are ways that you can do so:



Make a quilt with your Friendship Group, a couple of quilting friends or on your own to donate to our Live Auction. Lyn Mann has again graciously agreed to be our auctioneer. Nancy Ota, Ways & Means Chair last year, will be the coordinator of the Live Auction again this year.

- ★ Put together items with your friends, friendship group or other quilters you know. Select some yardage and fat quarters from your own stash, gently-used books or patterns from your quilting library and/or quilting supplies to donate for an Opportunity Basket. CURRENT FABRICS, BOOKS AND SUPPLIES ARE PREFERABLE IF AT ALL POSSIBLE! Last year we had 65+ baskets packed with wonderful items donated by our members, sponsors and area businesses.
- ★ Do a quilter's run to some shops (See the Adopt A Shop inset, below) or purchase an item to donate to include in an Opportunity Basket. Examples of items include gift cards to quilt shops, local restaurants (sit-down or takeout), coffee bars, manicure and pedicure salons, tickets to theaters, movies, performances, etc. Think of what YOU would like to win...be creative!
- ★ Donate new or gently used sturdy baskets that can be filled with items donated for the Opportunity Basket Drawings.
- ★ Volunteer for a committee to help plan November Fest. Signups will start at the August 9th general meeting. Helpers are needed for organizing, filling and wrapping the baskets, transporting the filled baskets to the event early on November 8, decorating the tables, donating food for the buffet, assisting the Hospitality Committee with food preparation and serving, selling raffle tickets, spotting bidders for the Live Auction, assisting the cashier (Treasurer), and cleanup of the room immediately after the Fest, etc. Sign-up sheets will be available at the August and September general Guild meetings.

Adopt A Shop!

The November Fest Committee is looking for quilters who like to visit quilt shops and would be willing to deliver letters asking for donations for our Annual Fundraiser. We are encouraging shops to donate a basket of wonderful items, such as fabric, quilting supplies, books, and gift certificates. Those who sign up to Adopt A Shop will be given a sheet of information and procedures. Copies of the request letter and donation sheet will be made available via e-mail. Volunteers will also be responsible for picking up the basket from the shop before the Fest by the October 11, 2011 meeting.

Please check out the Fest area at the August Guild meeting to see what shops need "adopting." With many of us helping out, the work load will be lighter for all. Let's work together to make our November Fest a success as we fund our programs, workshops, and philanthropic endeavors.

- ★ Most importantly, invite your family and friends to attend the November Fest with you. Plan to meet new friends, view the wonderful Opportunity Baskets and Live Auction items, socialize, partake of a delicious meal together, and HAVE FUN!







On Saturday, July 9, 2011, I attended the SCCQG quarterly meeting sponsored by Flying Geese Quilters Guild. Also in attendance from our Guild were Mimi Harris, Newsletter Editor, and Linda Rigdon, Welcoming Committee. The program was about Newsletters. Diane Searer, Flying Geese Quilters Guild Copy Editor, and our own Del Thomas, current Photographer and former Newsletter Editor, spoke about the ins and outs of Guild newsletters. A comparison was made between the newsletter and a friendship quilt. The job of the newsletter editor is to stitch together all the pieces (articles). Many worthwhile topics were discussed including the advantage of pictures, copy-editing and proofreading points, layout suggestions, and online versus hardcopy versions. Privacy issues regarding individual photos and quilt photos were also discussed as well as the importance of captions for pictures used in newsletter articles.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH Calendar of Houses

We're having fun again this year with Block of the Month and hope you'll be joining in. This year's theme is Calendar of Houses with the featured house associated with that particular month. The blocks will utilize both piecing and appliqué methods. Each month written directions and samples will be at the BOM table.



The first block was a June Bride house. For July the block was a patriotic White House, August will be a summer Bee Hive, and September will be a schoolhouse. It will be a surprise to see all the ideas we've come up with to symbolize the months.



The houses lend themselves to any number of colorways and styles. The finished blocks will be 12" x 12." The directions allow for the blocks to be sewn up exactly as written or with desired individuality. To achieve the detail we all

enjoy while conserving sewing time, let any number of themed fabrics do the work. In fact, donations of themed fabrics will be appreciated. Bring them to the BOM table for trading and exchanging so we can all share in "letting the fabric do the work!"

Block of the Month: Calendar of Houses

AUGUST - BLOCK NO. 3 - BEEHIVE HOUSE

Unfinished Block Size 12 ½" x 12 ½"

MATERIALS:

Sky Background: 1 fat quarter
 Ground Background: 8" x 14" scrap
 Roof and Beehive Building: 2 - 6" x 6" scraps
 Base, Legs and Bees: Scraps
 Fusible Web

APPLY fusible web to beehive and bee fabric pieces before cutting shapes.

NOTE: If not using fusible web, add seam allowance for machine and hand applique.

USING ROOF SCRAPS, cut 1 - 3 ½" x 5"

FOLD in half widthwise and cut diagonally to form triangle.

CUT ½" off top of triangle to create a flat roof.

USING BEEHIVE BUILDING SCRAPS, cut 1 - 4 ½" x 4 ½"

USING BASE OF HIVE BUILDING SCRAPS, cut 1 - 1 ½" x 4 ½"

USING LEGS OF HIVE BUILDING SCRAPS, cut 2 - 1" x 1 ½"


BEES: See template. Embroider or paint eyes onto bees.

DIRECTIONS:

1. Assemble background per photo, fusing ground background fabric onto sky background fabric.
2. Fuse house elements in place.
3. Fuse bees onto backgrounds in arrangement of your choice, ironing wings down first.
4. Press.
5. Square up to 12 ½" x 12 ½".

Let the Fabric Do the Work. Use bees from your fabric stash. Add trees, animals, the sun, stars, moon, bugs, people, to the background. Add circles to represent honeycombs.




