The project for August is #4.





BOM Mystery Quilt Block #5

This month, we are doing block 5. Again, since we are not doing the blocks in order, you will need to label your block when you finish it. This will be very important when it comes time to assemble your quilt top, because not only are we doing the blocks out of order, but **not all of the blocks are the same size**. Block 3 should have measured $10\frac{1}{2}$ " by $20\frac{1}{2}$ ". Block 5 will measure $10\frac{1}{2}$ " by $24\frac{1}{2}$ ". All of the block diagrams will have each piece marked with a number (the order in which they will be sewn together), a letter designating which fabric to put here (refer to your cutting instructions) and the size of the piece.

You will make this block in 3 sections as follows:


Section 1 – Join pieces 1 and 2. Press towards 1.

Section 2 – Join pieces 3, 4 and 5, then join these three pieces to 6. Press towards 3, 5 and 6.

Section 3 – Join pieces 7, 8 and 9. Press towards 7 & 9.

Complete the block by sewing section 2 to section 3 and then sew those two sections to section 1. Label it "Block 5".

*I have added pressing directions because it will help when the blocks are put together. This affects your "B" pieces, so press away from B on odd-numbered blocks and towards B on even-numbered blocks.

Lynn Tweet designed and pieced this “T-Shirt Quilt” for her daughter, a law enforcement officer and a registered nurse, who goes each year on her vacations to a foreign country. She loves to travel and spends a week each time volunteering with animal environmentalists caring for wild animals - elephants, lions. Recently she has been volunteering with a medical group going to Vietnam hill country to care for people who live in inaccessible areas. In her travels she has collected many T-shirts and asked me to make a quilt. She promised she would help me cut them and help in other ways. I am still waiting for her to come over to do that and when she does I will give her the quilt. Will she be surprised!!



“Denmark Beauty” was made by Mary Freedman as a 50th anniversary gift to her daughter Laura’s Danish “parents”. Laura was an exchange student in 1983-84, and, although it has been over 30 years, she still has a relationship with them. Thirteen of them spent two weeks with the Freedmans this past summer. The Danish mother’s reaction when she found out Laura and her children were coming was “Oh, good, all my children will be here for our anniversary party.” So this quilt will be taken to Denmark at the end of July, a gift from Mary and David.






