A representative from Hoffman Fabrics will attend at the August 13th meeting to present the "Hoffman Award" as well as give a short presentation about what's new in the industry (and we hope plenty of eye candy). Afterwards, we'll ask you to vote for your favorite entry and a crisp \$100 bill will be awarded to the "Viewer's Choice" winner.

The challenge committee was headed by **Jan Hirth** assisted by **Debbie Myers** and **Lyndy Dye**. Debbie cut the 45 yards of fabric. Lyndy and her talented son-in-law created the logo and designed the kits. **Phyllis Parente** constructed the beautiful award ribbons. **Helene Moser** hosted judging day at her home and served a wonderful lunch for the committee and the three judges from the Beach Cities Quilters Guild.

A SPECIAL AUGUST SEW-CIAL Wednesday, August 14, 9:30 AM - 3:30 PM

Our August SewCial features three members who will teach us three different mini workshops. **Janet Smith** will teach her zippered pouch class to make gusseted or plain bags. Please pick up directions at the meeting for the prep work that needs to be done before the SewCial, or read the July Newsletter/Workshop page.



Mary Arter will demonstrate beginning paper piecing. She is providing the kit for the class at no cost. Bring your machine if you'd like to sew, plus sewing supplies. These little flowers will make great pincushions for you or the Fest.



Betty Collins will be teaching embroidery stitches used to embellish your quilt or clothing. If you use a hoop please bring it, embroidery thread or pearl cotton, and supplies. Please bring either a piece of muslin, or wool to practice on.

The cost is \$10 per person. Take one or all three mini workshops; the cost is the same. SewCials are held at the San Juan Mobile Estates in San Juan Capistrano.



On Wednesday, September 11, our workshop is with Linda Sullivan of Colourwerx. Two techniques in one workshop! In part one, Linda will guide students through her liberating and fancy free slash 'n sew improv technique while making cute colourbug blocks - no 1/4" seams to follow, no rules and stress-free piecing.

Next, in part two, she'll guide students through sewing perfect curves with her handy tips and tricks; after a few practice blocks, students are guaranteed to conquer their fear of sewing curves with no tears. Both techniques come together in one workshop while working on this cute ladybug quilt.

This would make a darling baby quilt or gift for a young person. Sign up early for this workshop to secure your spot.

Workshops are held at the San Juan Mobile Estates, 32302 Alipaz, San Juan Capistrano. Turn south from De Obispo Street; the Estates is located about 1/2 mile down on left side. Time is 9:30 to 3:30 on the Wednesday following the Surfside General Meeting unless otherwise noted.

Any kit or book fees are payable directly to the teacher. The workshop fees are \$40.00. Please make checks to Surfside Quilters Guild; the bank will NOT accept SQG. SewCials are \$10.00.

Stephanie Ingle..... Fifteen years ago, **Stephanie's** newborn son Nathaniel was wrapped in the loving warmth of several Project Linus quilts while in the NICU. She was so appreciative of a stranger's kindness that she took an Eleanor Burns sampler class to learn the basics and she has been paying it forward ever since! She ultimately bought several machines, a long arm, and taught classes to a multitude of students ranging from 8 to 98 in Asheville, NC. They created many scrappy "kitchen sink" quilts with foundation pieced strips which were often donated to local women's centers. Stephanie also developed a technique to make t-shirt quilts more effectively. Her favorite esthetic is scrap quilts, batiks, and improvisational quilting. She uses them to produce unique totes, purses, clothing and quilts.

Stephanie grew up in Asheville where she was often creating with her grandfather in his wood shop. After attending college in Kentucky, she returned to teach 1st grade for 11 years and then 5th grade science. Her students were so fortunate to be guided by her creative, loving spirit as she developed her own curriculum. Stephanie is now a realtor and moved with Nathaniel to Dana Point several years ago. This gave them the medical and educational services they need to support him with Edwards Syndrome.




