

The turnout for last month's "sew-cial" was great - we had a full house. We are having another "sew-cial" this month, so once again you can have a great day of sewing for only \$10. All we ask is that you please sign up with us at Tuesday's meeting so that we can have enough stations set up for everybody. We will also be having 3 demos going on, which you take advantage of.

- 1. Sheri Hill will be showing us how to make the "It Just Doesn't Matter" quilt from scraps. If you would like to work on one of those guilts, bring a nice, big pile of scraps.
- 2. Odette Osantowski will be showing us how to make those beautiful bowls with clothesline and thread. If you want to attempt one at the workshop, you will need cotton clothesline (it comes in 100 ft. packages), which can be found at Lowe's or online from Ami Simms, thread (a large spool of 40 wt. variegated), a #14 or #16 jeans needle, 5-6 empty bobbins and a machine that can do a wide zig-zag stitch.
- 3. Joann Bishop will be helping with the block-of-the-month table runner.



President's Quilt for Betty Collins Odette Osantowski 949-489-9639

Quilt Theme: "**My Flower Garden**" Betty loves flowers of any kind. Her favorite quilts are appliqued, embroidered, red work, and African folk art. Please create your favorite flower block. Your block can be pieced, foundation pieced, fused, appliqued, fussy cut, using color crayons, or any technique you like. Betty will love all of them. Some ideas might be roses, daisies, hibiscus, cactus, tulips, etc. Some ideas will be available at the general meetings.

Colors: Bright and cheery.

Background: Light to medium blues. Background squares will be available starting at the January meeting, for you to use or you may use your own fabric. The squares available will be cut 6 inches to allow a bit extra around the applique. We will trim the blocks to size.

Block Size: 5-1/2" square unfinished, 5" square finished. The design team will trim down to the final size, just make sure your image fits within the finished dimensions.


Sign your block: Micro pens will be available at January through March meetings.

Due Date: The last time to turn in your block will be the Mar 14, 2017 general meeting.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH - DECEMBER 2016

We hope you have had time to catch up and are ready for the next phase. It is time to get out the rotary cutters and start the frame around the completed blocks. Keep in mind that we are going to finish the table runner in February and show it at the March guild meeting. Remember: In March there will be two raffle drawings for \$50 each to a local quilt shop!!! You must have your runner top done to be in the raffle.

This month we will be putting the "frame" around the three completed blocks.

Cut 64 2-1/2 inch squares in colors that coordinate or in neutrals of your choice to border the baskets and center patchwork.

Square up each of the three blocks to 8-1/2 inches.

Sew 20 squares around each of the baskets and the center patchwork. That will give you three separate blocks. **Do not sew together.** You will use 60 of your 2-1/2 inch squares. **Save the remaining four squares for next month when we do the sashings.**

OPTIONAL: To add some interest to the border make a few 4 patch or pinwheel 2-1/2 inch blocks (unfinished) to replace some of the squares to be sewn around the baskets and center patchwork.


