BLOCK OF THE MONTH - DECEMBER

THE BLOCK OF THE MONTH is a month by month chance to try something new. If you would like to bring in a block (or more than one) to try to win all the turned in blocks, you will need to follow the colors in the pattern. The drawing will be at the December meeting for this block.

For this month, the colors of reds and whites will be used for the challenge. The winner can make a You Send Me quilt to be enjoyed for the Winter holidays, St. Valentine's Day and the Fourth of July.

YOU SEND ME.

Envelopes hold letters of encouragement, love notes and small gifts. Sew these envelopes out of squares and rectangles, and drop someone a letter. You can even hide fabrics as the inside of the envelopes for children to find and match.

For each envelope, cotton fabrics in reds and whites:

2 - 5 1/2" squares outside color

1 - 7" x 3 3/4" rectangle, outside color, flap of envelope

1 - 5 1/2" square, inside, contrast or "surprise" print

Matching thread for topstitching.

Fold matching squares in half diagonally, right sides out. Press.

Place "inside" square on table, right side up. Place one folded triangle with the corner that has raw edges on either side pointing to the bottom left, aligning edges with the bottom square. Place the other triangle with raw edges on either side of the corner pointing to the bottom right, aligning edges with the bottom square. Pin corners of triangles only and press, making it possible to see the edge of the triangle that is in under. Carefully remove back square.


With matching thread, attach the 2 triangles together. Sew 1/8" from edges, from one bottom raw edge corner to the other, then continue sewing just inside where the triangles overlap, into the center of the overlap and back to the corner where you started. Place on top of "inside" square. This is the envelope bottom.

With right sides together, fold one long edge of the rectangle back on itself, so it is folded at the center of that long side. Using a 1/4" seam, sew along this edge. Press the seam open, flip, center, and match raw edges, creating flap triangle. Press.

Topstitch along the folded edges. This is the envelope flap. Finding the center, pin the center of the top edge of the "inside" square, seam down. The corners will be a bit long, and be trimmed later. The larger size of the flap helps to hold it closed.


Sew around square with basting stitch, 1/8" from the edge.

One envelope block is finished. To complete your project, blocks are assembled with sashing between the blocks, sized as you wish.



HOFFMAN FABRICS TOUR

Forty-five Surfside members took the tour of the Hoffman warehouse November 16. Michelle Flores, Marketing Coordinator for Hoffman Fabrics, showed the new fabrics from the company and explained the manufacturing process. The group also watched the employees putting fabric on bolts



Jan Hirth asked Michelle Flores at Hoffman Fabrics about the effect of the volcano in Bali on their facility for making batiks which has been there for 30 years. Here is her answer: "We're making a "plan B" should the volcano actually erupt. Right now it is spewing ash and "cold lava." Our factory should be OK. The residents have been aware for a long time now, and evacuations have been made. It might effect production somewhat since batiking is difficult under ash-y skies. I've been told the winds generally run opposite of the Hoffman factory, so that's some good luck. Transporting of goods may have to go by way of Jakarta since the Bali airport has cut back just about all service. Ash is not good for aircraft engines! Thankfully, we do have a lot of batik production for the near future already done."



