Judy's first memory of sewing is making a rag doll and doll clothes as a child. She took her first sewing lessons in 1964 but didn't start quilting until 1987. Her first quilting lessons were through the local adult school. After a move to California's far north coast, she began making landscape quilts.

Her first book, Simply Landscapes, was published in 1994. Her second book, the best-seller 9-Patch Pizzazz: Fast, Fun & Finished in a Day, was published in 2006, followed by Rectangle Pizzazz in 2008, both from C&T Publishing. Circle Pizzazz is Judy Sisneros' 4th book and the most original one yet. She started with the traditional block "snake trail" - re-cutting the block, adding pieces and getting a new original block.

Judy loves teaching and feels fortunate to be making a living doing something she loves. Judy tries to add a new workshop every year because so many of her students are repeat customers. Her love of people, travel, and fabric makes her an enthusiastic teacher! She lives in Rocklin, California, near Sacramento . **MAKE IT EASIER FOR US TO KNOW YOU - WEAR YOUR NAMETAG AT EVERY MEETING**







## SURFSIDE QUILTERS GUILD 2015 CHALLENGE - "IT'S ALL ABOUT THE WATER"

Are you ready for a new project? This year's Surfside Challenge is fun and simple. The theme is "It's All About the Water". This can be about the ocean, a lake, a river, a swimming pool, a glass of water, a puddle, the drought, etc. Make a wall size quilt, a table runner, a garment or a decorative item. You will need to purchase a kit for \$15 which includes three fat quarters of Hoffman's fabric. The fabrics must be used in quantities listed in the rules. There are only 60 kits available starting at the February meeting.

Challenges are due at the July meeting and will be displayed at the August meeting. They will be judged for special awards prior to the meeting. One entry will win Viewer's Choice at the August meeting and the maker will receive \$100 donated by Del Thomas. Some of the categories for awards are: best traditional block quilt, first time entrant to a challenge, best interpretation of the theme, best ocean, lake, river entries, best hand quilting, best machine quilting, best hand appliqué, most comical, and others to be determined.



### INSTRUCTIONS



**The kit:** Each participant must be a Surfside Quilters Guild member and must purchase a challenge kit. The kit costs \$15 and includes three fat quarters of challenge fabrics. There will be 60 kits available for sale at the February through June meetings on a first come, first served basis, one per member.

#### **The rules:**

Challenge entries can be a wall-sized quilt, garment or decorative item.

The perimeter of quilt entries **MUST** measure at least 48" but may not exceed 144".

You must use the equivalent of a 4x4 inch piece of one challenge fabric of your choice and a 2x2 inch piece of each of the two remaining challenge fabrics, visible on the front of your entry excluding the binding.

You may add as many other fabrics and/or embellishments to your entry as you wish.

Original designs are not a requirement.

All entries must have a label with the title of the entry and the name of the maker.

Sleeves are not required as quilts will be pinned for display.

Submission of the challenge entry gives permission for the entry to be photographed and for that photograph to be included in the newsletter and/or other medium.

**The deadline:** All challenge entries will be due at the July 14, 2015 meeting.

**Judging and Awards:** All entries will be judged prior to the August 11 meeting for special awards. Entries will also be judged for a Viewer's Choice award of \$100 at the August meeting.

We are well on our way into 2015 and we can hear the sewing machines whirring. Perhaps you are making a quilt using swap fabric??? This month we are swapping fabrics from the designer Kaffe Fassett. If you aren't familiar with Kaffe Fassett fabrics they are generally bright happy colors and prints and you can find them at a quilt shop or online.

Remember to include 12 ten-inch pieces of fabric in your plastic bag. Your name should be clearly visible. We will swap the fabric and you can pick it up at the next meeting. Please come back to our table for your packet or to get ideas!

### A REMINDER OF HOW IT WORKS:

- Wash, iron and cut selvages from 1 yard of good quality 100% cotton before cutting 12 ten-inch blocks.
- Put the 12 ten-inch blocks in a gallon plastic bag with your name written in large letters at the top. Also indicate that you have included 12 blocks.

We must receive 12 blocks in each plastic bag in order for the swap to work. The way the Swap works, you most likely will not receive any of your fabric back, so if you like your fabric be sure to buy a little extra to save for yourself.

MARCH: FLORALS

APRIL: BATIKS

MAY: BRIGHTS

Meet the Teachers will be held at the Carson Community Center, Saturday, April 25, 2015. Note that Insurance certificates require a written contract with each facility used.

January's meeting topic was Successful Workshops, Speaker was Marie Blash of Orange Grove Quilters Guild who stated that their guild does not lose money on workshops, and she then gave an informative talk of their policies. The notes from the talk will be on the SCCQG website.

The entire year of workshops is announced in December and is open for sign-ups. The list is on their website. All workshops are \$30.00 for members and are open to non-members for \$40.00. Non-members are given a spot on the waiting list and not given the class until it is decided that members will not fill the class. No one has the class until they have paid, the checks are deposited immediately. Refunds are given if there is someone on the waiting list to replace them. All workshops are promoted at each meeting on a display board with the teacher's photo and a description of the class posted... Models are displayed if possible. Members may be encouraged to sign up to gain friendships and skills. Members are reminded that they can change the color, size, arrangement, etc., of the projects. Consider the day a mini-retreat. A mid-day treat of chocolates are given. Name tags are supplied to encourage members to get to know each other and to aid the teacher. Skill levels and styles are diversified as much as possible. Teachers are suggested by the VP and approved by the board. Workshop Chair must be familiar with the teacher and what is to be taught and may take the workshop without charge. Supply lists are emailed along with the date and location. Students are charged \$1.00 plus postage for hard copy.

It was suggested that the list of teachers/workshops for the guild may be posted on the SCCQG website which would help guilds share the travel expenses of teachers.





**Cut 2---3 ½" X 12 ½" (A)**


**Cut 4---3 ½" X 4 ½" (B)**

**Cut 4---3 ½" X 8 ½" (C)**


**For Colored Fabrics:**



Scissors are one of those wonderful cutting tools that no quilter would be without. Scissors, like everything, had a beginning. The earliest known scissors of any kind appeared in Mesopotamia about 4,000 years ago. Most people associate the beginning with the Egyptians around 1500 BC. The modern "cross blade" scissors in use today were found in Rome as early as 100 AD. As the Romans traveled so did scissors. Pivoted scissors were not manufactured in large numbers until 1761. Robert Hinchliffe of London was reported to be the first person who put out a signboard proclaiming himself a "Fine Scissor Manufacturer". In 1649, in Swedish-ruled Finland, an ironworks was founded in the village of Fiskar. In 1830 a new owner started making scissors with the Fiskars trademark.



**Sally Reinholdt** shared her "Blue & White Hawaiian Sampler". She modeled her quilt after the traditional Hawaiian quilt using overlay appliqué. It is a sampler of different floral designs. It is completely hand stitched, hand appliqued, hand pieced and hand quilted. After it was assembled she added the white border to make it larger. The reverse is a collection of vintage C&H sugar sacks and rice sacks. Red piping was added for color. She dedicated the quilt to her mother who passed during the time she was making the quilt. Sally's last stitch was taken on her mother's birthday at the minute of her mother's birth.



**Carolyn Pierce** showed her "Ohio State" quilt. Her husband is a Ohio State football fan, so she had to show this today. It is a Disappearing Nine-patch.



“Blooming Together: (a group effort) was shown by **Nancy Ota**. On National Quilting Day (the 3rd Saturday in March) **Claudia Redfern** brings friends together to celebrate. In 2012 they decided to appliqué the flowers from “The Garden of Stitches” designed by Lisa Bongean, our January speaker. Each quilter chose a flower from the pattern and made 16 of the same flower. They were to mail the other 15 quilters one appliqued block plus 12 strips of bright fabric by Dec 1, 2012. The goal was to complete the quilts by National Quilting Day, 2013. Nancy used many of the fabrics she received to make the flying geese blocks; the outer triangles are the left-overs from snowballing the geese. Freddy Moran inspired the coloration. The label on the back tells the story of the quilt and who made each flower. The time consuming machine quilting was a challenge. The quilt won a judge’s choice award from Sue Nickels at the Pacific International Quilt Festival in Santa Clara in 2014. Thanks to Lisa for permission to show her design.




