

## WORKSHOPS

**On February 13** - Jill Finley's workshop will teach her Pedal Pushers pattern. Her designs show off her fresh style using high contrast fabrics with a bit of applique to soften and finish each design. Once the pieces are prepared, you can stitch either by hand or by machine.

The center applique block is 18" X 21." Jill will teach the applique and piecing on the quilt but you can also use the center block alone as a pillow or as a panel for a tote.

### Crab and Lighthouse Blocks

**Micelle Howe** shows "Starburst," a Kaffe Fassett dresden plate pattern with a modern twist.






