

Program - Elizabeth Eastmond

Beginning at A and ending at Z, **Elizabeth Eastmond** will take us on a journey of her lifetime of quilting in her lecture, **Abecedyary of Quilts**. This is not merely an "I can sew squares and triangles" lecture but a rich compilation of quilts and their stories and how quilting is woven through the highs and lows of our lives. According to Elizabeth, quilting is both powerful and necessary.

Elizabeth began quilting when she was expecting her first child. Now, retired from teaching English at a local community college, she quilts full-time,



writes full-time, and cleans house only occasionally, according to her blog.

She has been quilting for several decades and just finished her 240th quilt, a cozy flannel Christmas gift for her husband.

Her work has been published in magazines and books. Perhaps you saw her colorful and impressive **Shine: The Circle Quilt** (shown below), a work featuring 16 elaborately English paper-pieced circles, suns, and compasses in the magazine, *Simply Moderne*. The motifs in this piece were inspired by the decoration in a Slovenian church, discovered during her travels.

Her quilts have been juried into national shows, she has given demonstrations at QuiltCon, and recently worked as a quilt and pattern designer which gave her the opportunity to explore pattern and color.

Bucket List - also the theme of this year's Challenge.

Certainly, since we've all been in lock-down for almost a year, you must have plenty of ideas! **Lyndy Dye** had fun illustrating a few (photo left).

Your bucket list might have things you want to do when the pandemic is under control or maybe what you want to accomplish before you kick the bucket. What are these things? Visiting family, traveling to another country, eating out again, using up your stash, shopping, being with friends, having live SQG meetings, or even bungee jumping could be on your list.

Choose one of these or many to create an entry. [Rules for the Challenge are below.](#) Remember that **you need to include a bucket** somewhere on your entry. It can be very small as long as the judges can find it. Samples of bucket designs will be included in your kit.

Kits with three fat quarters of colorful **Hoffman** batik fabrics will be available for \$20 after the February 9th Zoom Guild Meeting. Pick-up instructions are noted on the Rules Sheet below.

Try to get your Challenge Kit during the week after the meeting by texting, calling, or emailing one of the committee members. If this is not possible, we can mail the kit to you or make other arrangements. We might even deliver! Pick-ups will be socially distanced outside. Please plan to wear a mask.

Entries are due by the July 6, 2021 Guild Meeting. The quilts will be judged and on display at the August 10th meeting. Some of the categories for judging are:

- Best interpretation of the theme
- Best use of Challenge fabrics

- Best original design
- Best use of a traditional block
- Best use of embellishments
- Best machine quilting
- Best hand quilting
- Best machine applique
- Best hand applique
- Most humorous
- Best non-quilt entry
- Most interesting bucket
- Hoffman's choice
- Viewer's Choice - \$100 cash prize.

"Bucket List" Instructions

The Kit:

Each participant must be a Surfside Quilters Guild member and must purchase a challenge kit. The kit costs \$20 and includes three fat quarters of challenge fabrics. There will be 60 kits available for sale at the February thru June meetings on a first come, first served basis, one per member.

The Rules:

- Challenge entries can be a wall-sized quilt, garment or decorative item.
- The perimeter of quilt entries **MUST** measure at least 48" but may not exceed 144".
- You must use the equivalent of a 4x4 inch piece of one challenge fabric of your choice and a 2x2 inch piece of each of the remaining two challenge fabrics, visible on the front of your entry excluding the binding.
- You may add as many other fabrics and/or embellishments to your entry as you wish.
- A bucket of any size must be visible on your entry. (Samples provided.)
- Original designs are not a requirement.
- All entries must have a label on the back with the title of the entry and the name of the maker.
- Sleeves are not required as quilts will be pinned for display.
- Submission of the challenge entry gives permission for the entry to be photographed and for that photograph to be included in the newsletter and/or other medium.



The Deadline:

All challenge entries will be due by the July 6, 2021 meeting. Turn in will be determined by the status of the coronavirus.

Judging and Awards:

All entries will be judged prior to the August 10 meeting for special awards. Entries will also be judged for a Viewer's Choice award of \$100 at the August meeting.

President's Quilt - Batik STARS - Monica Shafer

Brilliant!

That's what **Mary Arter's** President's Quilt will be—a sparkling galaxy of bright, colorful batik stars. Let's fill her quilt with your blocks.

Here are the details:

- Fabrics: Batiks in bright colors or use a batik fabric with stars in it
- Background: any bright colored batik
- Star: any bright colored batik
- Design: Your choice, however, it should be a STAR
- Methods of construction: traditionally pieced, appliqué, fused applique, foundation paper-pieced, English paper-pieced, embroidered, Broderie Perse
- Any style: traditional, wonky, improv
- Size: 5 1/2 inches unfinished. Do not trim the block, leave it slightly oversized. We will trim them. Please make sure your design fits into the five inch finished size; we do not want to trim off the tips of your star.



Please remember to **SIGN your block** with a permanent marker.

Please mail your block to me; my address is in the Guild Directory or you may arrange to leave it on my front porch.

Join us in poultry piecing to celebrate these barnyard wonders!

Optional one hour follow-up class to be determined.

You will select from five patterns to create your chicken wall hanging. A brief discussion introduces the methods and techniques of freezer paper templates. You will then prepare a freezer paper template for your chicken pattern and begin the process of selecting fabrics for your design. Sewing methods and sewing order to complete the wall hanging will also be discussed.

Ann P. Shaw teaches the wonderful **Ruth McDowell** style of quilt design. You will get to choose from five Chicken Challenge Patterns; these will be available for purchase prior to the workshop. Check out Ann's work and patterns at www.annshawquilting.com.

Now, Michelle is intrigued by all areas of quilting. She sets an annual goal to learn something new. In 2021, it is paper-piecing. Many workshops and classes at Asilomar led her to become an art quilter.

This was begun in Jan Hirth's class in 2006. Jan used the pattern from "Free Spirit Brushstrokes" collection. Pineapple is a modified log cabin and this technique uses the "Snowball" technique to trim the corners. The corner trimmings were resized and used in the border.

The pandemic lockdown forced me to look at the mess in my sewing room. I found this box of blocks and strips and decided to finish it. As I messed up by not following instructions, the quilt became smaller. The reds are mixed because I didn't have enough of any one red. The light blue fabrics are tie dyed indigo (cotton shibori) from an old yukata. The small dark stripe fabric strips are from another old yukata that was repurposed. All the others are Japanese prints of various weights and textures.

The back has yukata cottons.

This is my quilt from the December "Winter Wonderland Challenge" organized by the Flying Geese Quilters Guild.

My quilt is called "Snow Day." It is hand appliqued, pieced and quilted by me. I have had the pattern for years and the Challenge was a good excuse to make it. We had to use cheesecloth somewhere on the quilt and I found that the most difficult part of the Challenge. (Cheesecloth is flimsy and difficult to work with.) Fun fact, the trinket on the dog's collar says "Hope." I thought that was perfect for the year we have had.
