

Janet Shannon - Family Ties
When I saw **Nancy Ota's** tie quilt I knew I wanted to make one for our son using my husband's ties. I took Nancy's class and embarked on a year and a half project. There are 491 pieces in the quilt, all hand English paper pieced and machine quilted by me. I used silk yardage for the backing and Hobbs Thermore ultra-thin batting. The ties represent the years my husband worked to provide for his family. The quilt was a labor of love on my part, hence the name "Family Ties". It was shown at the Pacific International Quilt Festival and has been accepted at Road to California.

Roni Trehy - Baby Cassidy (right) Soft batiste cotton in pink and light green. My neighbor's baby is due Christmas Day. The Daddy-to-be asked me to make the quilt. He is delighted and can't wait to see it.



My Christmas Quilt (left) **Roni Trehy** made and quilted this Friendship Star quilt as her first and only Christmas quilt. She tried to use non-traditional fabric while keeping to the red and green colors.



Kris Kouzelos - Snowman Tote (left) Made of recycled wools and cotton fabrics. She saw this bag at a fabric store last week on the Shop Hop with friends. She had to go home and make one from memory and thinks hers turned out bigger. She wants to make a smaller one without the snowman to use as an everyday purse.



Susan Adams - Red & White Christmas Tree
Made with fused circles and hand quilted. She saw this quilt at a quilt show. At home she Googled "red and white Christmas trees" and a picture of this quilt came up. She cut out red circles and began. She put large loops on the back so she can hang it over a picture in her dining room.



Angela Irish - Christmas Star (Ohio Star pattern) (right) She made it in one of Jan Hirth's classes when she was just beginning to quilt. She took Jan's class to learn some techniques. 

Jan Kerr - Bernina Christmas Applique, machine embroidery. One of the first long-arm quilts she and her husband Terry did together.



Monica Shafer - A Winter's Dance She made this quilt from a pattern by Robyn Pandolph. Hand appliqued, machine pieced. After seeing this quilt at A Time to Sew, Monica knew she had to make one for herself. Machine quilted by Rags to Riches.



Maggie Bell - Baby Pillow Her daughter made a Christmas flannel blanket for a very good friend's new baby using these fabrics, so Maggie created this pillow from the leftovers. She says it was fun to start and finish a project in only one day.



Odette Osantowski - Fall Leaves From a pattern in "Quiltmaker" 1987. This quilt was made for my mother Mary Mayer, for her birthday in September 2011. I started it while staying with mom during treatment for leukemia. I had just finished the applique pieces when she suddenly passed away in June 2011. It has been sitting in my sewing room, waiting to be finished.



Hiroko Moriwaki - Surfside Block of the Month - the first SQG BOM (left) Hiroko finished the top in 2010, but the shirt block didn't have enough contrast so she took it out and it became the label. "This was my 8th UFO that I've finished this year and I feel so good!"



Hiroko Moriwaki (above) shows her Japanese Colorwash Fan. I took a workshop with JoAnn Belling in 2002, but made some changes to make me happy. My husband Yoshi loves this quilt and wants to hang it in his office. It is machine quilted in the fan area, but I hand quilted the rest. My family crest is embroidered. This is the 7th UFO Hiroko has finished this year.



Jeanne Tavasci made "Precious Angles" from a pattern by Primitive Gatherings. She saw the quilt in Fat Quarters Quilt Shop in Vista and thought it was so sweet. She bought the pattern and a fat pack of tiny print fabrics. The blocks in the pattern were set straight but she placed them on point. She did the machine quilting and says she is very pleased with the way the quilt turned out. She is keeping this one!



Vicki Janis bought the pattern for "Holiday Lights" by Alex Anderson at Road to California last year, not having a clue how many little teeeny tiny pieces are in it. For this lap size quilt, there are 780! Twelve days ago she started this adventure, waking up at 3 am to sew. It's done and she can't wait to throw it over the back of the couch.



Charlotte Spere's quilt made from a "Quilt in a Day" pattern using Christmas fabric. She intends to make a scalloped edge for it now that she knows more about binding from the recent workshop. She will keep the quilt for herself to use during the holidays. Quilted by Nancy Burch.

Please remember to bring snacks the month of your birthday so we can all celebrate with you.


We have no Sunshine nor Shadows this month.



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Introducing... Marcia Faultersack

Marcia is a Southern California native with a husband, three sons, two daughters-in-law, four grandchildren – and a yellow Labrador retriever. Her grandmother, an expert tailor, taught her to sew. Although she didn't enjoy sewing clothing, she values the skills she learned. She fell in love with sewing 20 years later, when she began quilting, and she took class after class from Suzanne Stanton. Then it was on to Quilt-in-a-Day, where she took the weeklong teachers' course. This led to her teaching quilting classes in her home and making custom quilts. When the cost of sending their sons through college required her to go back to "real" work, i.e., work that would actually make some money, she worked as an executive secretary for the local school district. Marcia retired from Capistrano Unified School District five years ago, became a charter member of SQG, and has written 39 interview articles for the Guild's newsletter.



A couple of the non-quilting highlights in her life, other than her family and friends, are: 1) Going on a photo safari to Kenya with her mother-in-law that was supposed to be quite luxurious, but turned out to be a budget deal. (Her mother-in-law got a huge refund later.) It was a lot of fun because they had to set up their own tents and there were mostly young, budget-minded people who had loads of energy and enthusiasm, and 2) When she and her husband built a home on a small ranch, she trained an Arabian horse that had never been ridden and went on to win a blue ribbon with that horse.

Marcia and her husband are beginning a new adventure. They have moved to Oklahoma City due to the transfer of her husband's job. Gratefully, this assignment will last only one to two years and then they will move back home. Meanwhile, she is looking forward to visiting the three quilt shops in Oklahoma City and may join the guild there.



BLOCK OF THE MONTH QUILT MUG JANUARY 2013

1/4" seam allowance


Make one Block 6 1/2" x 6 1/2"

Create the mug handle


1. A Cut two mug fabric, 1 1/2" w x 1 3/4" h
2. B Cut one mug fabric 1" w x 1 1/2" h
3. C Cut two background fabric 1 1/2" x 1 1/2"
4. D Cut two background fabric 1" x 1"
5. E Cut one background fabric 1" w x 1 1/2" h




6. Lay C over A, right sides together, mark diagonal line, sew, press flat, then press towards mug fabric, trim away excess (stitch & flip method)







7. Lay D over the opposite corner of A, right sides together, mark diagonal line, sew, press flat, then press towards mug fabric, trim away excess (stitch & flip method)



8. Your block should look like this diagram



Repeat on the opposite sides of the remaining A fabric to create the bottom end of the mug handle



9. Sew E to B, press towards B
 10. Sew EB to each of the angled handle sections, press seam open
 11. Sew one F to the top and bottom of the handle section, press towards F
- The handle row is now complete

12. Sew H to the top of G, press towards G
13. Sew I to the bottom of G, press towards G
14. Sew one J to the right of GHI, and the other J to the left of GHI. Press both towards GHI

15. Sew one K to the top of GHIJJ and the other K to the bottom, press both towards mug
16. Sew other K to the bottom of GHIJJ, press towards mug
17. Sew the handle row to GHIJJKK, press towards the body of the mug
18. Sew one L to both sides of the mug and press towards the mug
