## Friday, January 25, 2019

# PRESIDENT'S QUILT



## WORKSHOPS

with Vivien Hawker, Jane Salem



Our **January 9** workshop is “Weave That Quilt” with Jennifer Rapacki. Create a unique textured background for a small wall quilt by weaving one inch wide raw edge strips of fabric on the diagonal, along with your choice of raw edge applique. Kits will be available for a sea turtle, cactus or poppy. Go to [jenniferrapacki.com](http://jenniferrapacki.com) to see more of her work

**On February 13** - Jill Finley’s workshop will teach her Pedal Pushers pattern. Her designs show off her fresh style using high contrast fabrics with a bit of applique to soften and finish each design. Once the pieces are prepared, you can stitch either by hand or by machine.

The center applique block is 18” X 21.” Jill will teach the applique and piecing on the quilt but you can also use the center block alone as a pillow or as a panel for a tote.

### Crab - Under the Sea ...8<sup>th</sup> Block of the Month



You can use fusible applique or another method if you prefer to make this block. It is cut 8.5 inches wide and 6.5 inches high. This happy little crustacean is on the beach getting a sun tan. Have fun with this; there's only one more block until we show you how to put it all together.


