This year is the 25th anniversary of the Road to California Quilt Show and promises to be especially spectacular. The quilt exhibit area at the Ontario Convention Center has been enlarged by making some dramatic changes: all the vendors in the ballroom have been moved to the Exhibit Hall and Pavilion (the tented area outside). Most of the quilts have been moved to the ballroom, providing a more relaxed, peaceful venue to view these amazing creations.

Surfside Quilters Guild members and friends will travel to the show on a 55-seat motor coach on Friday, January 24, 2020. The cost is \$40, and includes the show ticket (wrist band—good for all weekend), transportation, water and a snack on the way home. To date, it looks like all seats are reserved; however, I am assembling a waiting list in case of cancellations. Because of your creativity and generosity, Surfside Quilters Guild donated 392 quilts to groups and individuals in 2019. All of you are awesome for donating your time and talents to bringing love and warmth to so many people! Our most recent donation was 16 quilts to Sea Crest Hospice.

With the start of a new year, please consider making an entire quilt or a quilt top to be quilted and bound by other members. What kind of quilts do we need?

- 1—Baby quilts: These can be lap size (about 40 inches square) or crib size (about 34 x 52 inches). While soft pastels and baby prints are traditional, many new moms like a modern look, so solids or graphic prints can be used, too. These are a good opportunity to use flannel, minky, or other soft fabrics you may have.
- 2—Adult quilts: Our most requested is lap size (about 40 inches square), but we like to have larger quilts, too. Color and design can be just about anything—be creative! Don't forget the guys—we can always use quilts in "masculine" colors and prints.
- 3—Patriotic quilts: Every year, we have a few requests for red/white/blue quilts for service members and veterans. For these, larger than lap size is preferred, but please feel free to make what you like.

You can use your own fabric or take advantage of Philanthropy's stash. We receive many generous donations of fabric. Come browse through our bins and get inspired to make a Philanthropy quilt!

There are many other ways to help, too. Are you cleaning out a sewing room? We accept donations of fabric, quilt tops, and "never-gonna-finish" quilt projects, including orphan blocks. We find creative ways to use what we receive. Help us choose backs and binding at our monthly sew session, or cut fabric for kits to assemble. We welcome whatever you can do.

Finally, support our efforts by shopping our monthly fat quarter sale. We try to have a new assortment at every guild meeting. Come check it out!




