


Logo Wall hanging Wednesday, July 14, 10-4, Fee: \$30 plus \$3 materials fee for pattern and lame thimble fabric.





Trees Please: Block of the Month

July 2010

Fruit Tree – Apple, Cherry, Lemon, Orange, etc.

Finished Block Size: 15”W x 12” H

Unfinished Block Size: 15W ½” x 12 ½” H

Materials

Background Fabric: 16W x 13H – to be finished at 15W x 12H

Tree top Fabric: 12W x 9H

Tree trunk Fabric: 6W x 6W

Scrap Fabric for Fruits, Heart

Fusible Web

Directions

1. Following directions on fusible web, and using full size patterns provided, transfer tree appliqué onto background material, per attached photo.
2. Stitch down appliqué using blanket stitch, hand or machine decorative stitch, straight machine running stitch, or any combination of stitches.

Directions for Completion of Block

Embellish with patterns provided, or use buttons, embroidery stitches, free motion circles on sewing machine, fused felt, wool, velvet, etc.

Heart Appliqué: Add initials, monogram, arrows, et, al. If desired: add clouds, grass, critters, etc. to background.

Trim block to 15 ½” W x 12 ½” H
