“Twenty Tips & Tricks for Better Machine Quilting” with Cindy Seitz-Krug



Cindy started quilting 1993 when her mother signed her up for a beginning quilting class in Ventura, CA. She was immediately hooked on quilting. She's spent the years since then evolving into the quilter she is today.

Cindy considers herself a traditional quilter, but really likes innovative quilts which take traditional patterns and enhance them. She believes her strongest quilting asset is her machine quilting (all done on a home sewing machine). From the moment she starts planning a quilt, she also starts planning the quilting. Making the quilt even more beautiful through the quilting stitches and designs is the part she enjoys most.

Cindy has won hundreds of awards for her quilts in regional, national and international quilt shows, including the Houston International Quilt Festival, AQS Shows across the country, the Pacific International Quilt Festival, Road to California, and many more. Some of her most notable awards are Best of Show honors at an AQS show, as well as Road to California and PIQF (with Molly Hamilton-McNally in a duet project).

Cindy teaches and lectures around the country, as well as teaching two on-line classes with iquilt.com. She has recently written a book that will be published by AQS and released in the fall of 2016.




July - Domestic machine quilting with Cindy Seitz-Krug

SURFSIDE QUILTERS GUILD FABRIC FUN 2016

PATCHWORK RUNNER
FIRST MONTH

BLOCK ONE and BLOCK TWO are made with half square triangles. The blocks finish at 4 inches so the unfinished size is 4.5 inches.

For Block one:

Cut two 3 inch squares using light/medium fabric
Cut two 3 inch squares using dark fabric

Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back side of the light/medium fabric. Put a light/medium square and a dark square right sides together and sew a scant 1/4 inch on both sides of the diagonal line. Cut on the diagonal line and press to the darker side. Do the same for the other squares. Trim all of the squares to 2.5 inches. Sew the blocks together following the pattern of block one.

For Block two:

Cut two 3 inch squares using light/medium fabric
Cut one 3 inch square using one dark fabric
Cut one 3 inch square using a different dark fabric

Use the half square triangle construction method above. Sew the blocks together using the pattern of block two.

Square up both blocks to measure 4.5 inches.






Sumi Maruyama showed three garments she made under Nancy Ota's instruction.





“Capturing the Colors of California - Hues, Tints, Shades, and Tones”

HUES are the fundamental pigments that identity the full gamut of colors.

TINTS are merely any colors with white added.

SHADES are humbly any color with black added.

TONES are initiated by greying down hues with both white & black.

As you travel around the highways, byways, unknown locations, and surprising vistas in the state of California, what colors are unique to that particular spot? Is it the blues of the oceans, the greens of the forests, the neutral tones of the desert, the oranges of the poppy fields, the varied colors of the mountains or a cityscape? There is a continuous difference in the colors affected by the surrounding environment, temperature and the weather conditions from one moment to the next. Select a color scheme of your choice inspired by that particular place in California. Next, create a quilt utilizing the chosen colors. What traditional or contemporary block(s), appliqué pattern, or mixed quilting techniques could be used to enhance the colors? The quilt can be traditional, modern, or an art quilt.

Parameters:

Create a quilt based on the theme “Capturing the Colors of California.” **Guild members can make a new one or enter one already in hand which fits the description above.** THIS IS NOT A JURIED SHOW. ALL QUILTS WILL BE **ACCEPTED.** **This is your chance to have a quilt in a major show.**

There are no size requirements. Embellishments must not protrude more than ½” from the surface of the quilt.

The quilt must be made with fabric and quilted either by hand or machine or both. It must consist of three layers, and be either bound or closed along the edges.

On the reverse side include a label with your name, email address, mailing address, phone number, and quilt title and the guild to which you belong. A four 4” sleeve is required.

Your entry must be free of any text or images protected by copyright, unless you have the expressed written permission from the person or institution that holds the copyright and you provide that written permission with your submission.

The entry form must be completely filled out including a brief statement sharing your inspiration for the quilt linked to the theme of the challenge of no more than 150 words. Include a photograph of your quilt with the entry form.


