

Do any of you remember **Georgia Bonesteel's** Spinning Spools Quilt Pattern Club?

Well, this was my introduction to quilting in the early 1990's. I received an offer in the



mail and signed up. Every month patterns arrived for three blocks (as I remember). By the time the club ended, I had three fat binders full of patterns! These were all traditional designs—there was no hint of modern or improv quilting at that time. I made some quilts using these patterns but no longer have them—all were gifted to friends and family.

The 1990's was pre-Internet. I didn't know anyone who made quilts and had no idea that quilt guilds or workshops existed. I learned on my own to make quilts from Georgia's patterns as well as from American Quilter and Quilter's Newsletter magazines. After a few years, I stopped sewing quilts. It was fun but time consuming and other things demanded my attention.

I returned to quilt-making about seven years ago when I was ready to retire and move to California. What a difference 25 years made! There are so many resources available on-line and design options stretch far beyond traditional patterns. I also discovered this guild and I've been thrilled to be inspired by the work of our speakers as well as our members. It's also been exciting to acquire new quilting skills from some terrific teachers.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH



2021-2022

Block #3 12x12

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

For fabric choices refer to the block diagram

- A:** 4 squares $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$
- B:** 8 squares $2'' \times 2''$
- C:** 4 squares $4\frac{1}{4}'' \times 4\frac{1}{4}''$, split crosswise into 16 triangles
- D:** 8 squares $3\frac{7}{8}'' \times 3\frac{7}{8}''$




ASSEMBLY


- Referring to **BASIC INSTRUCTIONS** stitch and flip technique make a corner unit with two B squares and an A square as shown. They should measure $3\frac{1}{2}''$ square. Make four corner units.



- Referring to **BASIC INSTRUCTIONS** half-square-triangles layer two D squares. Make a total of 4 half-square-triangle-units. Trim the units to $3\frac{1}{2}''$ square. Split remaining D squares diagonally in halves.



- Sew together two C triangles - 4 as shown and 4 reversed - and press. Make eight units. Add a D triangle to make a half-hourglass unit that measures $3\frac{1}{2}''$ square. Make eight.



- Arrange corner units, half-square-triangles and half-hourglass units as shown into four rows. Sew the units into rows and press. Join the rows and press to complete the block. Block measures $12\frac{1}{2}'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}''$.

Bodacious Bloomin' Curves Made Easy!

ZOOM Workshop

Instructor: Linda Sullivan, Colourwerx

Wednesday, July 14th - 1:30-4:30pm (3 hours)
Thursday, July 15th - 10:00am - 1:00pm (3 hours)
Fee: \$25 for Guild members; \$40 nonmembers

These gorgeous and bodaciously big Modblossom blocks go together quickly. With clever cutting on a few fat quarters and Linda's tips and tricks for using template shapes, students will work on blocks in class.

With Linda's guidance, students will perfect their 1/4" seam, learn easy half-square triangles, and sew perfect curves--guaranteed no fear and no tears. All of these techniques come together and create beautifully big blossom blocks. Make 12 blocks for a 60x80 quilt; four blocks makes a lap-size version.

The pattern is included in workshop fee.


