There is a kit fee of \$5.00 payable to the Instructor at the Workshop.


## Joann Loves Her House Quilt





- WHAT YOU WILL NEED (per block)**
- Blue (a)= 4 – 2 1/2" squares
  - 2 – 2 7/8" squares
  - Gold (b)= 1 – 2 1/2" square
  - 2 – 2 7/8" squares
  - White (c) = 2 – 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" strip
  - 1 – 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" strip
  - Red (d)    1 – 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" strip
  - 2 – 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" strip




- Star**  
You will need 4 half square for this block.
1. Mark two 2 7/8" gold squares diagonally through the center.
  2. Place right sides together with blue square. Sew on either side of the line at 1/4". Cut on line.









1. Cut pieces as indicated, template instructions on page 2

Sew sections to form rows

2. Sew A to B, press towards B

3. Sew C to AB, press towards AB  
Repeat with other C and press

4. Sew D to E, press towards E  
Repeat with other D and press


5. Sew G to F, press towards F  
Repeat with other G and press

6. Sew H to J, press towards J  
Repeat with other H and press  
Sew K to H, press towards H  
Repeat with other K and press

7. Create templates for L and M from page 2  
Sew M to L, press towards L  
Repeat with the M reversed and press

8. Sew N to P, press towards P  
Repeat with other N & P  
Sew NP to R and press towards R  
Repeat with other NP to R  
Sew NPR to Q, press towards NPR  
Repeat

Sew S to NPRQ and press towards NPRQ,  
repeat with other S
