SQG welcomes Jenny Lyon and her humorous look at how quilting affects our lives and relationships with a trunk show of award winning garments and quilts. Jenny has been joyfully teaching the art of quilting since 2006.

Her classes are encouraging, supportive, and light-hearted. She loves seeing students realize that they CAN quilt their own work on a domestic machine. Jenny teaches at various guilds, shops, and events throughout the country as well as at IQF Houston.

She hails from a long line of traditional bed quilt makers, but didn't take a formal class in quilting until 1983. Jenny "re-entered" quilting in 1999 and took that one class that unleashed a need to create that has not stopped.

She uses her domestic sewing machine to create art quilts and wearable art and loves to watch the machine stitches create line, texture and shadow as they merge on the surface of the fabric.

Her current work is centered around whole-cloth pieces, with intricate free-hand free-motion quilting. Because there is little or no piecing, the story is told through the line of the thread. She considers this work to be "sculpting" the fabric, since the stitches create line and shadow upon the quilt's surface.

Jenny calls herself the Quilt Skipper because once while quilting her own quilt, she was so delighted by the unexpected beauty of it and what emerged from the needle, she found herself cheerfully skipping around the house when taking some breaks. It is her joy to create art with free motion quilting.



Wednesday, April 15, 2020 Workshop

Arabesque with Dora Cary. Create a strikingly beautiful quilt using foundation paper piecing. You can use as few or as many fabrics and colors as you wish. A Color Me page comes with the pattern so you can create your own design and color combination.

A Tree Skirt version of this pattern is available. Techniques taught in this class are foundation paper piecing, matching seams, binding inner and outer corners.



....**JOHANNE GIBSON** ~ **Johanne** was born to sew! Her mom was a Home Ec teacher and started passing along her sewing skills when **Johanne** was ten. She then made many of her own clothes and continued sewing for her own daughter and grandchildren. A Home Ec teacher herself, **Johanne** was bitten by the quilting bug 25 years ago when her college age daughter wanted some decorative pillows. **Johanne** was the manager of the Leah's store in the Mission Viejo Mall at the time and surrounded by inspiration. The watercolor technique became her impetus to quilt and a Trip Around the World came first. She has also made five Irish Chains patterns in this style ranging from wall to king size and the blended look still influences her quilting today.



Johanne is a California girl born and bred. After growing up in Chula Vista, she and her husband John moved to Orange County. They had a unique opportunity to leave California for a while in 1967 when John was drafted into the army and posted to Alaska. Living in Delta Junction, 100 miles from Fairbanks at the Cold Weather Test Center, was a real experience. Between the seasonal extremes in daylight/darkness to the 40 below temperatures, the young couple must have looked forward to their return to Orange County in 1969.

In addition to sewing and quilting, **Johanne** reads with several book clubs and plays scrabble, bridge, and canasta with groups in her neighborhood. Salmon Coconut Curry Soup

Here is a delicious soup recipe that can be adapted to include your favorite fish and vegetables followed by a yummy spring time dessert.

2 tsp canola or olive oil
 1 medium onion, diced
 2 carrots, sliced into 1/2" rounds
 2 cloves garlic, minced
 1 Tbs minced ginger
 1 Tbs curry powder
 1 tsp cumin
 1/2 tsp salt
 1/4 tsp cayenne(optional)
 2 cups vegetable broth
 1 14-oz can light coconut milk
 2 Tbs tomato paste
 1 pound skinless raw salmon, cubed
 1/2 cup uncooked white rice (optional)
 1 cup frozen peas
 juice of one lime or 1/2 lemon
 cilantro or parsley for garnish (optional)

Heat the oil in a pot. Add the onions and carrots; heat over low heat until onions are soft. Add garlic, and heat for a minute. Add ginger, curry, cumin, salt, and pepper (or whatever spices you're using), stir with vegetables for about a minute. Add broth, coconut milk, and tomato paste. Bring to a low boil, reduce heat.

Add salmon, rice (if using), and peas. Simmer, partially covered, for 10 minutes, or until rice is tender. Add juice of one lime and garnish with cilantro. Enjoy!




