## HANG 10 ~ 2019 GUILD CHALLENGE

Surfside's fourth challenge is now underway. Have you started yours yet? If not, here are some suggestions. Find a block with 10 pieces such as a log cabin, flying geese, pineapple, Dresden plate, etc. Think of 10 items such as candles, fingers or toes, children, birds, circles, squares, etc. With the stripe fabric, you can cut it into color strips and use similar colors from your stash. If you need more of the stripe fabric or the other two fabrics, contact Jan as she has some extra pieces.

The kit can be purchased until the June meeting but hurry as there aren't many kits left. Remember that besides a small quilt, you can make a table topper, table runner, pillow, wearable art, or any other item.

The rules are in the kit or look back at last month's newsletter. Prize ribbons will be given for such categories as best interpretation of the theme, best original design, best use of the challenge fabrics, best use of a traditional block, best use of the stripes, best use of embellishments, best machine quilting, best hand quilting, best machine applique, best hand applique, most humorous. And there will be a Hoffman's Choice chosen by a Hoffman representative.

The Viewer's Choice award will be \$100 donated by an anonymous quilter.

with Linda Rigdon, Past President



This delicious bread was enjoyed by all at the Joint Board meeting In April. **Debbie Myers** shares her mother's recipe for **Mom's Banana Nut Bread**.

½ cup softened butter  
1 cup sugar  
2 eggs, beaten  
3 bananas, mashed (@ 1-1 ¼ cup)  
2 cups flour  
1 tsp baking soda  
1 cup chopped nuts  
¼ tsp salt

Cream softened butter. Add sugar, eggs, mashed bananas. Sift flour with soda and salt. Mix two mixtures together. Add nuts with a little flour sifted over them. Mix again.

Pour into sprayed/floured loaf pan. Bake at 375 degrees for one hour. Let cool 5 minutes in pan, then turn out onto cooling rack. Slice when completely cool.

### **TATTING SEWCIAL SUPPLY LIST:**

**Tatting shuttle** (plastic ones are about \$2 each.)

**#10 Crochet thread.** Please make your life easier and get thread that has a strong twist to it. Without the twist, the knots don't slide well; the better they slide, the easier it is to tat.

**Scissors.**



On **Wednesday, June 12** we will have Tiffany Hayes teach her Icicle Burst pattern. The beautiful crisp points of Icicle Burst are easy to achieve with foundation piecing. The pattern is included in the workshop. You will be using The Mini Goddess Tool which Tiffany will supply for you to share in the workshop. 




