OCTOBER WORKSHOP– Crayons & Paper Doll Quilt

Embellished heat set crayons & embroidery with Patricia Beaver.

The same workshop is offered two separate days at two different locations.

Wednesday, Nov 11, 2009, from 10 AM to 4 PM at the Community Presbyterian Church , 32202 Del Obispo, San Juan Capistrano, CA

Thursday, Nov 12, 2009, from NOON until 6 PM at "A Time to Sew", 27071 Cabot Rd, Ste 101, Laguna Hills

Cost of each workshop is \$30 plus \$4 (for enlarged pattern of either a boy playing marbles or a little girl with a broom) payable to the instructor on the day (see page 1) of the workshop. This workshop does not require a sewing machine.

Patricia will teach how to transfer the pattern to the fabric, advise us on coloring techniques, heat setting the crayon on the fabric, fusing fabric for the doll's clothing and, finally, showing us embroidery techniques to embellish the block. Prairie point construction will also be taught to further embellish your quilt. Additional ideas will be shared about locating patterns to use for the other blocks.

Shhhh, Patricia says it is secret.





STASHBUSTERS WORKSHOP FOR PHILANTHROPY

This month we'll be working on an auction quilt we're calling Retro Redwork Kids, which we'll donate to CHOC. Anyone who's ever wanted to do redwork embroidery but just never got the chance will get to learn a new skill. Those of you who already know how, can enjoy working on this fun project. Everyone will get to have their own block to work on. Along with the redwork, we'll enhance the blocks with some of the crayon methods taught by Patricia Beaver at the November workshop. When all the blocks are done, we'll sew them into a top, which we'll have quilted before we send it off to CHOC


Our stocking project is going strong. We passed out approximately 88 kits, and we had about a dozen completed stockings on display. Our goal is to have 100 stockings completed to turn in to Kids Kon-nected. Make sure to bring back the completed stocking NO LATER than the November meeting. Kids Kon-nected is scheduled to work with another local group who will fill the stockings with donated toys. The filled stockings will then be given out to the children they serve at their holiday party in early December.

Sailboat

9 1/2" unfinished block with half-square triangles

Surfside Quilters Guild is up! Each month make blocks for your own Surf's Up sampler quilt. This month make two Sailboat blocks. Following the picture tutorial will simplify the construction of this block.




Figure 1: Draw vertical lines every 3 1/2", then draw diagonal lines.





Figure 2: Sew 1/4" on both sides of diagonal lines.



Cut fabrics for two blocks:

- A: Cut four 5" x 3" rectangles of sky blue.
- B: Cut one 3 1/2" x 14" strip of sky blue.
- C: Cut one 3 1/2" x 14" strip of white.
- D: Cut two 10" x 2 3/4" strips of red fabric or color of your choice for boat hull.
- E: Cut two 2 3/4" squares of sky blue.
- F: Cut two 10" x 3" strips of water blue.

Make eight 2 3/4" (unfinished) half-square triangles:

1. On wrong side of white fabric C, draw lines with a pencil every 3 1/2" going the short way, then diagonally (Fig. 1).
2. Place white strip C and sky blue strip B right sides together. Sew 1/4" on both sides of drawn lines (Fig. 2).
3. Cut on drawn vertical and diagonal lines.
4. Press seams towards blue. Square up to 2 3/4". You will need 8 squares.

Sew together:

1. Align one E square on end of D rectangle. Sew diagonally from upper right corner. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Press towards D.
2. Sew 4 half-square triangles together to form boat sail.
3. Sew an A piece to each side of half-square triangle units. Press towards sky blue.
4. Sew sail unit to boat unit (D-E) then to water strip F. Press sky-sail unit towards D then D towards F.
5. Press block and square up to 9 1/2" x 9 1/2".
