Our October speaker is the esteemed quilter, educator, author, designer, pattern maker, and November Fest auctioneer Lyn Mann.



Her program is devoted to borders and all you ever wanted to know about them. Lynn will show many quilts with pieced borders and explain how she chooses and constructs them. Spacer borders will be explained so we can make any border fit any quilt.

Lyn is a past president of Flying Geese Quilters Guild and has taught all over the US, including Road to California, Quilt Utah, Camp Watch-A-Patcher and Quilt Camp in the Pines. She's been a teacher on seven quilting cruises, to Alaska, Hawaii, and from the coast of West Africa to Barbados. She's well known locally for her mystery quilts, and out of the over 440 quilts she's made, 70 of them were designed as mystery quilts. Lyn has been featured in many publications, including six quilting magazines.

Be prepared to learn a lot about those tricky borders that sometimes stump us when the body of a quilt is completed. Bring your questions.

WORKSHOPS

with Vivien Hawker, Jane Salem



October 10, “No Ugly Fabric” with Lyn Mann. Finally!! We have a workshop where we don't have to spend a small fortune on fabric and supplies. In fact, this class helps you learn how to best use the fabric IN YOUR STASH. All of us at times have seen a lovely, wonderful fabric we must have, then can't seem to find a way to use it in a quilt. This class teaches how to put ugly, colorful or hard to use fabric with a fabric that brings out the best in it and makes both fabrics bring out the best in each other. To do that, participants in the class use their stash, bringing 6" squares of non-ugly fabrics in a range of dark, medium and light color values in a wide variety of colors and prints. Then the magic happens. Lyn's expert instruction shows students how to put together pairs of fabrics to make Birds in the Air blocks with simple piecing, and the results are stunning. Even if a whole quilt isn't completed, this is a must take class for the lifelong lessons

On November 14, we are combining with Philanthropy to meet at the San Clemente Presbyterian Church downstairs hall from 10 AM to 2 PM. **No workshop or SewCial in December.**



On January 9, our workshop is “Weave That Quilt” with Jennifer Rapacki. Create a unique textured background for a small wall quilt by weaving 1 inch wide raw edge strips of fabric on the diagonal along with raw edge appliqué. Look at Jenniferrapacki.com for more information.

On **February 13** - Jill Finley will be teaching Traditional Appliqué.

On **March 13** - Pam Hadfield workshop with Wool Appliqué.

Workshops are held at San Juan Mobile Estates, 32302 Alipaz, San Juan Capistrano, (turn south from Del Obispo Street; the Estates is located about 1/2 mile down on left side), 9:30 to 3:30 on the Wednesday following the SQG general meeting unless otherwise noted.


HOSPITALITY

Our community was devastated by the Carr Fire with 1079 homes destroyed. Our guild, the Quilters' Sew-Ciety of Redding has a lofty goal of providing a quilt to at least each household (and in many cases to each child affected) by this disaster. The fire moved so fast that many people fled in a hurry and lost almost everything. I can't even describe the devastation, but many neighborhoods look as if a bomb went off.

We wanted the victims of the Carr Fire to have something of comfort, and for many, this will be a new family heirloom to treasure.

We are collecting new quilts, lap size and larger for our friends and neighbors who lost their homes in the Carr Fire. They can be for kids or for adults.

Donations of supplies will also be collected to make quilts using newer quality quilt shop fabric, batting (Warm & Natural, Quilter's Dream, Hobbs) and thread.

We are asking our members to volunteer their help. PHD (Projects Half Done) members have been busy working on lots of unfinished projects. Many of the ladies have finished eight projects since February! **The project for October is #4.**




