

SEPTEMBER 12 WORKSHOP WITH WENDY MATHSON: STORM AT SEA


Are you familiar with the traditional pattern known as "Storm at Sea?" The pieced units are made with straight lines, but they combine to give an illusion of waves or curves. Wendy is author of "A New Light on Storm at Sea Quilts: One Block - An Ocean of Design Possibilities". She has invented a new way to piece Storm at Sea using a "trim after you sew" method. This is easier, faster, and more accurate than typical template piecing. No paper piecing, no fussy alignment of angled pieces, and no bias on the outside edge of the blocks! In the workshop you can choose to make one of three variations to suit your taste and skill level. If you are confident with your rotary cutting skills and can sew a quarter inch seam, you will be successful in this class.





We Went to the Fair






On the Wounded Warrior table

WOUNDED WARRIORS

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

"Spinning Star"



WHAT YOU WILL NEED (per block)


- Beige (a)= 4 – 4 ½" squares
- 1 – 5 ½" square divided into 4 quarters
- Medium (b)= 1 – 4 ½" square
- Dark (c) = 1 – 5 ½" square divided into 4 quarters
- 1 – 2 ½" x 12 ½" strip
- Light (d)= 2 – 4 7/8" squares divided in half diagonally



Sew the short side of the beige and dark quarter triangles as shown here. (4 total)



Sew those to the long side of the light triangle as seen here. If necessary, trim back to a 4 ½" square.



Sew all together as shown.

The finished block should measure 12 ½" square.

Although her mother and sister were interested in quilting, Carolyn would have none of it. But years later, when her youngest son was to be married, she thought it would be fun to make him a quilt to celebrate the event. She

knew the Rail Fence pattern, so she made a quilt top, but then didn't know what to do next. What saved her was enrolling in one of the first classes at Adult Ed taught by Suzanne Stanton...that was the beginning of her continuing love for the craft.

Now there has followed a long line of quilts made for her other two children when they married, for her grandchildren when they were born (all 13 of them), and then more quilts as they graduated from high school. As these grandchildren marry, she makes a quilt showing their progress through various stages of life using ink-jet fabric pictures. And now she's starting the process all over again with her 11 great-grandchildren!

Carolyn grew up in Ohio. Following her husband's term in the Air Force and after they both graduated from college, they made their home in Guam, teaching school. After that they lived a short time in Albuquerque, New Mexico, ending up in California. Carolyn taught school a total of 25 years and has been retired for 22 years.

When she's not busy quilting, Carolyn and her husband travel quite a bit, much of it with Elderhostel. Among the places they've visited are Alaska, Tonga, Fiji, Samoa, Hawaii, New Zealand, Russia, and Europe. Last, but not least, she heads a small group at her church that makes prayer quilts; since 2002, these women have sewn and given more than three hundred quilts to church members and their relatives.




September Block of the Month - Sewing Machine


BLOCK OF THE MONTH SEWING MACHINE SEPTEMBER 2012



To create section A Cut one 3 1/4" x 1 1/2" sewing machine fabric

Cut two 1 1/2" x 1/1/2" background fabric

1. Sew background square to A rectangle, right side to right side as shown (stitch & flip method)
2. Press towards sewing machine fabric, trim backside
3. Repeat with other background square, press, trim backside




1/4" seam allowance

background indicated by shaded color

Completed block 9 1/2" x 6 1/2"

To create the spool

1. Sew C to B and repeat, press towards thead fabric
2. Sew D to CB, press towards D



Make one sewing machine block

To assemble the sewing machine block

1. Sew H to G, press towards G
2. Sew I to GH, press towards I
3. Sew J to GHI, press towards I
4. Sew K to A section, press towards A
5. Sew L to AK, press towards L
6. Sew M to AKL, press towards M
7. Sew N to AKLM, press towards N
8. Sew O to AKLMN, press towards N
9. Sew AKLMNO to GHIJ, press towards GHIJ
10. Sew P to AKLMNOGHIJ, press towards AKLMNOGHIJ
11. Sew E to spool, press towards spool
12. Sew F to other side of spool, press towards spool
13. Pin E, the spool and F to the sewing machine section, matching seam on right side of spool, press towards sewing machine.
14. Button optional
