





Applications with description were requested by July 25; due to the lack of time given to entries and poor response, the deadline was extended. **Nancy Ota** sent requests-to-enter to fourteen Surfside Quilt Guild members and received responses with applications from two quilters. **Odette Osantowski** will enter "Christmas Cactus" and **Nancy Gasparotti** will enter "Diamond Drops". Also shown will be **Nancy Ota's** quilt "Infinity" and "Garden Jubilee" by **Jan Hirth**. **Nancy Ota** will act as the area coordinator for Orange County. The quilts must be sent to her in early September and delivered to Pam Overton by Wednesday, September 17. At the end of the show the Mancuso team will re-box the quilts and ship them to the area coordinator.

SUPER SWAPPERS PLEASE JOIN US IN THE NEXT SWAP!!

Thank you so much for the great response to the polka dot swap our first month and again for the batik swap in August. We are so happy that you all are enjoying the swap! Please come and pick up your packet with all of the swapped fabrics at the Super Swappers table. If you haven't participated and want to know how it works, this is what you do:

-Wash, iron and cut off selvages from 1 yard of good quality 100% cotton before cutting twelve 10-inch blocks.

-Put the twelve 10-inch blocks in a gallon plastic bag with your name written in large letters at the top. Also indicate that you have included 12 blocks.

WE MUST RECEIVE 12 BLOCKS IN EACH PLASTIC BAG IN ORDER FOR THE SWAP TO WORK. THE WAY THE SWAP WORKS, YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE ANY OF YOUR FABRIC BACK SO IF YOU LIKE YOUR FABRIC BE SURE TO BUY A LITTLE EXTRA TO SAVE FOR YOURSELF!

SEPTEMBER: Stripes

OCTOBER: 2 possible swaps....Christmas and/or light neutrals**

NOVEMBER: Civil War

DECEMBER: 2 possible swaps....red prints and/or black and white prints**

**when there are 2 possible swaps you may participate in one or both swaps. Each plastic bag must contain 12 blocks of just one of the swap choices. Please do not mix the two swaps to make up a total of 12 blocks.


We have had another fabulous Show and Tell in August. Thank you to the 15 quilters who shared 19 quilts. With these quilts they have shared their lives with us.





Pinwheel Star



Unfinished size 12


These directions are for one block.

- Cut (1) 9" square of dark print A.
- Cut (1) 9" square of light print B.
- Cut (1) 4 1/2" X 8 1/2" rectangle of dark print C.
- Cut (1) 4 1/2" X 8 1/2" rectangle of light print D.
- Cut (1) 4 1/2" square of accent print E.



1. Make a half-square triangle with the 9" squares. Trim to 8 1/2" square. This will make 2 half -square triangle's . Only use one for each block.

2. Sew C to E.
3. Sew B-A to D
4. Sew C-E to B-A-D.



Ursula Hartunian says that constructing her “Patriotic Sugar Swirls” quilt was similar to making a “Stack and Whack” quilt.



