Let's Get to Know.....Nancy Gasparotti

Getting to know Nancy is like opening a present with layers of paper inside the box. There are so many beautiful layers to Nancy. She is known for her generosity and her creativity, which takes many forms.

Sewing has been a part of her life since she was a child as well as through the years that her children, Randy and Susan, were small.

Before she had a family, she taught two years as a junior high math teacher and one year as a high school French teacher. Later she returned to college to get an MS in Computer Science and was a software engineer at Intel and other firms in Silicon Valley.

Leaving the computer industry and moving to Laguna Beach in 1989 with her husband J.J., she studied to become a certified personal trainer. She had been active in a health club, and for two years won their "most physically fit" member contest in the women's master category. Nancy also studied photography as a serious hobby and had a darkroom in her home. In 1994, she exhibited in The Festival of Arts in Laguna Beach.

In 2001 She got a job at UC Irvine as a programmer. She joined a craft group of UC Irvine staff, most of whom were quilters. The quilters meet once a month and make quilts for UCI Cancer Center patients. Nancy enjoys this philanthropy work, knowing that the quilts are a source of comfort. With a goal of one quilt month, Nancy has made at least 200 philanthropy quilts.

The quilts Nancy makes are influenced by improv and scrappy styles. In the beginning, the Gee's Bend quilts, Freddy Moran and Gwen Marston were big influences. Nancy feels that she "doesn't want to make a quilt that somebody else has already made," but rather to have her creations reflect her creativity. She believes that handmade items carry the spirit of those who make them.

Nancy has also made 100 or more 12 inch original quilted blocks that she shipped to the UK which were then assembled into quilts for orphanages in Africa.




Nancy has served as co-chair for Monthly Minis as well as donating a unique quilt every year for the November Fest auctions.

3. Volunteer to help with set-up (afternoon of Nov. 12) and/or as a runner/checker at November Fest. I will have sign-up sheets available.


Even if you haven't signed up for a basket yet, it's not too late! Just bring it to the October General Meeting—the more the merrier!






