

David Taylor's obsession with fabric began at an early age when he salvaged scraps from his mother's sewing trash bin. By the time he was 12, he was unstoppable on her 1967 Sears Kenmore sewing machine, creating costumes, clothing, and crafts. It wasn't until he landed a job at a big box fabric store and met Madeleine Drake Vail, that he realized there were others in the world who were also addicted to fondling fabric.



In 1999, more than a decade into their friendship, he and Madeleine collaborated on a fund raiser for the Strings in the Mountain Music Festival. Their task was to create a queen-sized art quilt for the Festival's annual poster design. The quilt would also serve as a major silent auction item. No pressure. The final bid for the quilt was \$25,000. They both now quilt as a way of life.

David retired from a career as a computer graphic artist in July 2009. Since that time, he has enjoyed teaching his appliqué and quilting techniques throughout the world. He currently lives in a 195 year old house in Henniker, New Hampshire which is a five minute walk from a favorite quilt shop.

Block of the Month - Judy Kamman & Holly Betz



BLOCK OF THE MONTH

2021-2022

Blocks #5 6x6 & 6x6

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

For fabric choices refer to the block diagram

A: 12 squares - $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 1\frac{1}{2}''$

B: 4 squares - $2\frac{3}{8}'' \times 2\frac{3}{8}''$

C: 2 squares - $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$

2. Using 4 A squares for each, arrange squares to make 3 four-patch units. They should measure $2\frac{1}{2}''$ square.




3. Arrange the four-patches, half-square triangles and squares as shown. Sew the units into rows and press. Join the rows and press to complete the block. Block




With the fabric and pieces you prepared the BLOCK BLOCK measures 6 1/2" x 6 1/2".

ASSEMBLY

1. Referring to BASIC INSTRUCTIONS half-square-triangles layer a light and a dark B square. Make a total of 4 half-square-triangle-units. Trim the units to 2 1/2" square.


Block 2 of 2

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

For fabric choices refer to the block diagram

- A:** 8 squares 1 1/2" x 1 1/2"
- B:** 4 rectangles 4 1/2" x 1 1/2"
- C:** 4 rectangles 2 1/2" x 1 1/2"
- D:** 1 square 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

2. Arrange remaining A squares, B rectangles and center square into three rows. Sew the units into rows and press. Join the rows and press to complete the block. complete the block. Block measures 6 1/2" x 6 1/2".






ASSEMBLY

1. Arrange and sew the four A squares, C rectangles and D square into three rows. Sew the patches into rows and press. Join the rows and press to make the block center. It should measure 4 1/2" square. 1/2" square.

Pictorial Hand Appliqué

Summer Gardener



This workshop demonstrates my layered, hand-appliqué technique with simple appliqué shapes using freezer paper templates and liquid starch. The class will cover how I build my pictorial wall quilts and how to get beautiful details by letting the fabric choices do all the hard work.

STUDENT SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- Paper scissors and fabric scissors
- Hand-sewing needle: I use Bohin, Long Appliqué, size 10
- Iron and ironing surface
- Hand-sewing thread:
I use YLI Soft Touch cotton (60#)
- Appliqué pins: I use Bohin
- Pencil or mechanical pencil
- Resealable plastic bag to hold appliqué shapes
- Finger stiletto – (trolley needle, optional, but very useful)

STUDENT KIT FEE: \$30

Kit includes all pre-washed fabrics needed for the block, fat-quarter background, pattern, full-color instructions, freezer paper templates and tracing paper for overlay.

Becky McDaniel - Orange Peel Pillow

Machine applique (with foundation that puffs after washing)

Wednesday, October 13, 2021

San Clemente Presbyterian Church (downstairs) **This is an in-person workshop.**

\$25 for SQG members; kit fee of \$35 due at workshop



Becky will teach a machine-applique technique that will look like hand-applique when you are completed!

We will make this scrappy 20 inch Orange Peel pillow using a foundation paper inside the applique that, when soaked, will change to a puffed fiber.

Because your applique fabric will be prewashed and shrunk and the rest of the fabric is not, this will pull the stitches into the base fabric, making them disappear.

Kit available for purchase. Becky says this about the kit:

I will have kits available at \$35 for the 20" pillow top which will include:

- 25 different precut 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " blocks for the scrappy background
- 25 different 3"x6" **pre-washed/shrunk appliqué fabrics** (mostly Kaffe)
- 20" of applique foundation paper
- 3 mylar circles
- Polka dot fabric for flower centers
- Wool batting to stuff the circles

If you already have fabrics you want to use I will have the foundation paper available for purchase as well for \$3 for 20". Or, you can go to [purpledaisiesquilting.com](https://www.purpledaisiesquilting.com) to order.

Let's Get to Know - Holly Betz

Karen Wendel's path to quilting began when as a youngster her mom taught her to sew. Many of her dresses and garments were made by her mom. The quilter in the family at that time, was her grandmother and Karen used her beloved Dresden Plate quilt on her childhood bed.

Her own quilting journey began in 1978 when she bought a sewing machine and, with her sister-in-law, took a pillow sampler class. Many other classes followed and in one, she began a queen-sized sampler quilt. It was a 10-12 year project and was her first and last hand-quilted piece. Karen remembers taping this quilt to the kitchen floor and basting it while eight months pregnant! Raising five children certainly explains the gaps in this quilt's progress.

Karen retired from teaching about 10 years ago after enriching the lives of many preschool, kindergarten, and elementary school-aged children. Retirement has enabled her to enjoy all of her other creative outlets including stained glass, mosaics, and crocheting prayer shawls for her church.

She loves applique and recently added wool projects into her mix. Karen also has more time to spend with her three grandchildren who live locally. Surfside Quilters Guild also benefited from Karen's retirement; she has been VP Membership and is in her fourth year (and probably most challenging year) as VP Facilities. Thanks to Karen, we now have a new place to meet.

Karen's involvement with Philanthropy escalated when she purchased a long-arm quilting machine. After practice machine-quilting 150 pieces for Philanthropy, she launched a new long-arm quilting business, **Stitch n' Thyme**. If that wasn't enough to keep her busy, Karen has a new little buddy, Charlie. He's an 11-week old mini Aussie-doodle puppy and is definitely keeping her on her toes!


