### Intro to Heat-Set Machine Applique—Coral Vine/Morning Glory

Wednesday, June 12, 2024

9:30 AM to 3:30 PM

Gloria Dei Lutheran Church - Dana Point

**Description:** In this class you will learn to use a “collage with templates” technique: totally new and you will use nothing else once you try it. It is easy, foolproof, and the results are always amazing. This technique produces a **no-fray raw edge appliqué**. Grace will demonstrate and you will practice. The students will get a pattern of the Coral Vine/Morning Glory (approx. 24” wide x 20” high) and will choose the one they want to do. Grace will demonstrate each step as you make the quilt of your choice. Come to learn and practice this technique with the inventor, developer, and teacher of this amazing new, revolutionary appliqué technique. In addition, you will also get introduced to the concept of VALUE and learn how to choose your fabrics, design, and execute the design using VALUE.

**Kit:** Grace provides a kit that includes the pattern, the **Heat-Set** product, dispensing bottle with flip top, pins, and the value matching tool. The price of the kit will be \$36, payable directly to Grace Errea.

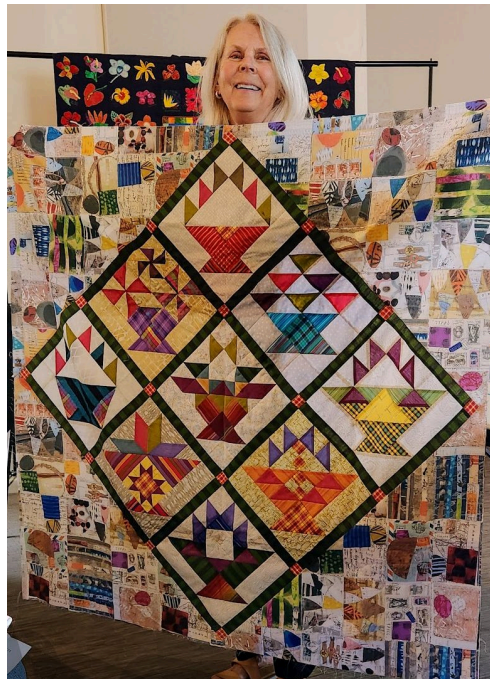

## BLOCK OF THE MONTH "OH MY STARS" Judy Kamman & Holly Betz

We are creating a star studded Irish chain quilt for BOM 2024-25.

The patterns would adapt well to a holiday theme or limited color palette.

The nine blocks (12" finished) will be combined with sashing to finish at 44" square.

An additional border can be added for a 48" square.

The star blocks are Moda Blockheads 5 patterns. You can join a Facebook group (Moda Blockheads 5) to see posts of multiple fabric options of finished blocks for inspiration.

**Fabric requirements:**

1 1/2 yard background fabric for blocks and sashing

3/4 yard print for chain and border  
 Assorted fat quarters or scraps for the stars



## June 2024

Our star blocks will be in an Irish chain setting.  
 Only one block is required for June, but these directions  
 provide instructions to make all four chain blocks.  
 If you prefer, go ahead and make all four blocks now.



### Cutting requirements:

Two strips 2-1/2 inches by WOF (width of fabric) background  
 Two strips 2-1/2 inches by WOF print

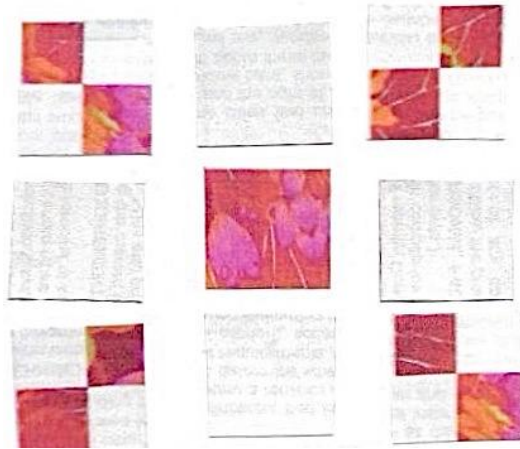
Two strips 4-1/2 inches by WOF background  
 Cut these strips into 16 4-1/2 inch squares

20 inch x 4-1/2 inch print strip  
 Cut into 4 4-1/2 inch squares

### Seeing Directions:

Sew 2 strip sets of 2-1/2 inch background fabric and print fabrics together, press. Cut into 2-1/2 inch units.  
Flip to make a standard 4-patch unit.

To assemble one block, sew together in 3 rows the following sets:

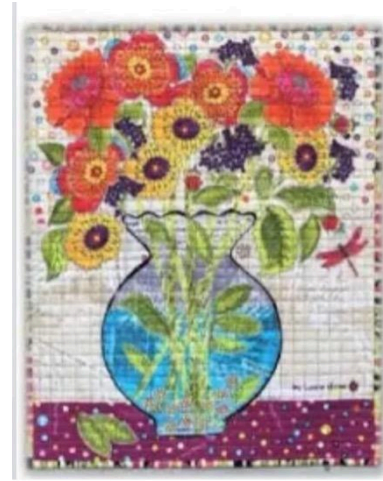
## Laura Heine-Style Collage--Bouquet

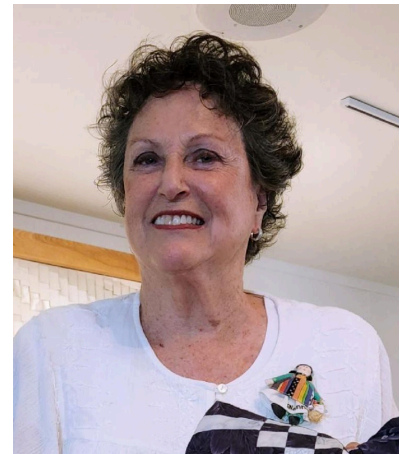

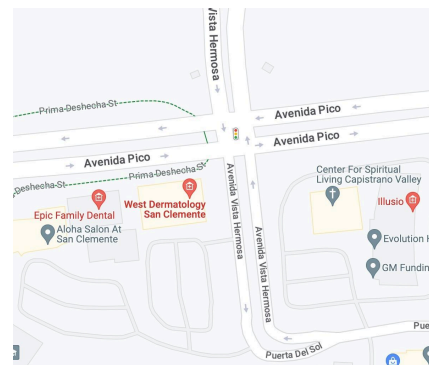

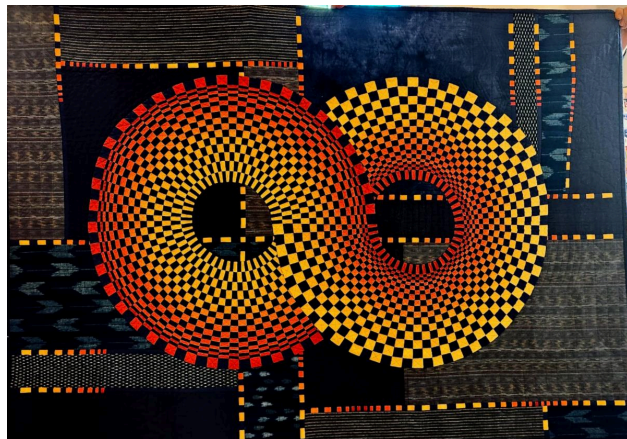

**This Recipe Was Enjoyed at**  
Chinese Chicken Salad  
Jeanette Brooks

Put in bowl:

- 2 bags chopped cabbage (then I chop up finer), or you can buy a small head of cabbage and chop fine in your food processor
- 4-6 green onions, chopped
- Generous amount of sliced almonds, roasted
- 2 chicken breasts, cooked and shredded
- 2 packages of Ramen noodles, crushed



Dressing (I put in a jar and shake thoroughly before putting on salad)  
 1 cup vegetable oil  
 6 Tbsp. rice wine vinegar  
 4-5 Tbsp. sugar  
 Salt  
 Pepper

Assemble salad and stir all together.

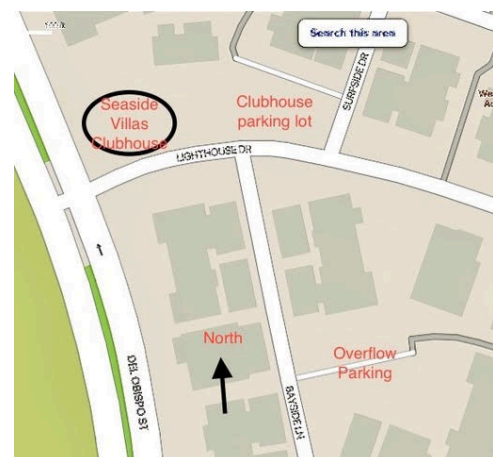

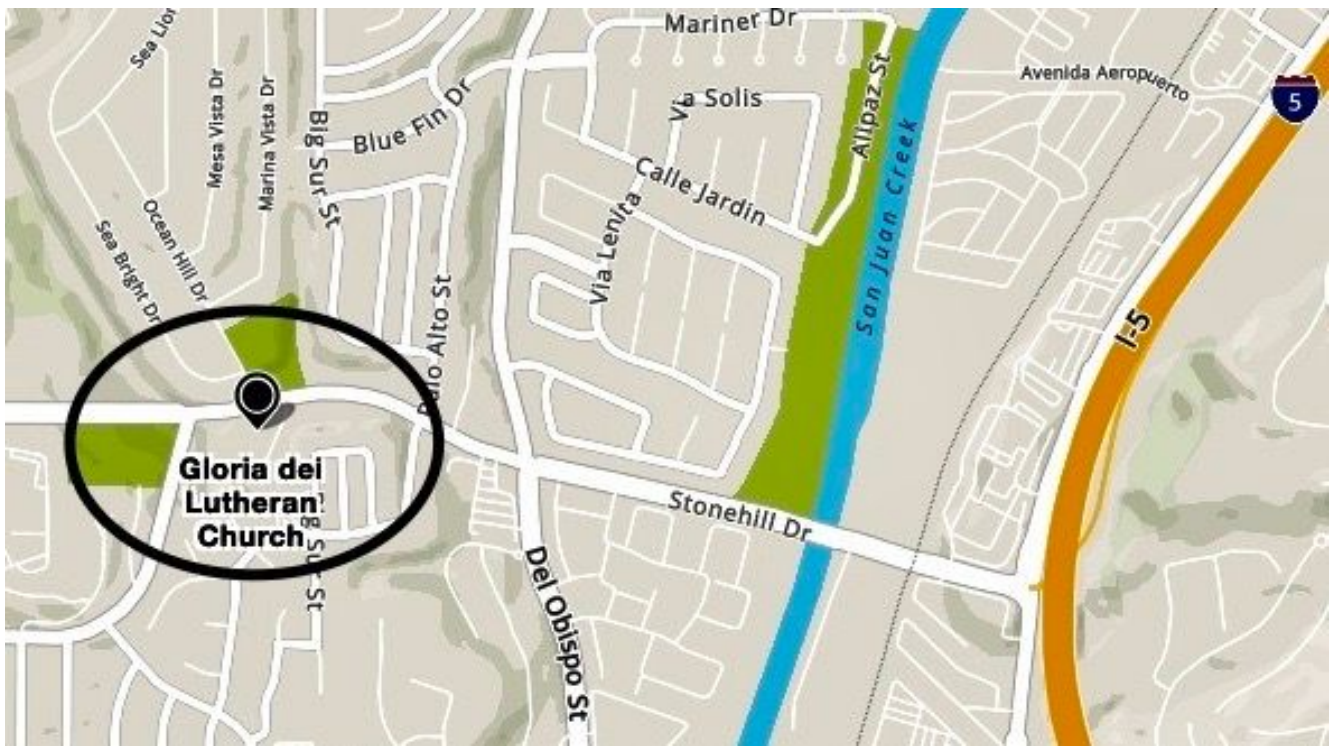
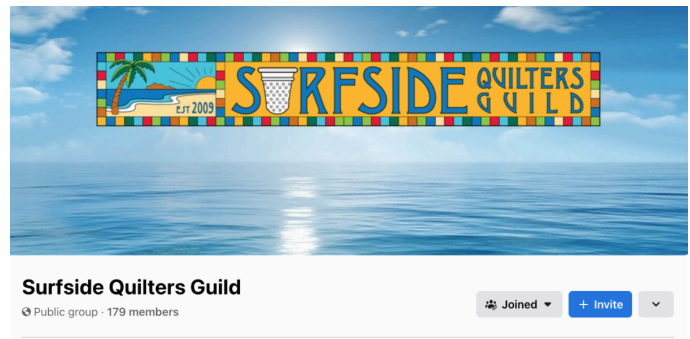
