Grace Errea Intro to Heat-Set Machine Applique—Coral Vine/Morning Glory

Wednesday, June 12, 2024 9:30 AM to 3:30 PM Gloria Dei Lutheran Church - Dana Point

Description: In this class you will learn to use a "collage with templates" technique: totally new and you will use nothing else once you try it. It is easy, foolproof, and the results are always amazing. This technique produces a **no-fray raw edge appliqué**. Grace will demonstrate and you will practice. The students will get a pattern of the Coral Vine/Morning Glory (approx. 24" wide x 20" high) and will choose the one they want to do. Grace will demonstrate each step as you make the quilt of your choice. Come to learn and practice this technique with the inventor, developer, and teacher of this amazing new, revolutionary appliqué technique. In addition, you will

also get introduced to the concept of VALUE and learn how to choose your fabrics, design, and execute the design using VALUE.

Kit: Grace provides a kit that includes the pattern, the **Heat-Set** product, dispensing bottle with flip top, pins, and the value matching tool. The price of the kit will be \$36, payable directly to Grace Errea.

Wine & Quilting - Mary's President's Quilt Update

As I write this, Mary's President's Quilt is still traveling between quilting bees. The BIG REVEAL will be at the May meeting when it is presented to her in appreciation for leading the guild in a successful year of interesting speakers, challenging workshops, a record number of quilt, pillowcase and stocking donations, an exceptionally profitable November Fest, a cozy tea party New Member Tea and much more.

Quilts like this don't just happen—just like SURFSIDE QUILTERS GUILD'S achievements this past year, it was the culmination of the work of many, many guild members.

Odette Osantowski helped me design a pieced goblet block—refining my penciled version into a polished design.

I'm grateful to everyone who made a block and especially to those of you who made multiples. It took some prodding—thank you, Michelle Howe for your e-blasts—but the final number of blocks was sufficient to construct a good-sized quilt.

Two generous long-time friends, Nancy Ota and Jan Hirth, used their exceptional appliqué skills to sew the quilt's banner. My newest friend, Tania Owens, provided the embroidery using her massive professional machine and colorful rayon thread.

A small but mighty group, Jan Hirth, Charlotte Runyan, Marcia Kuehl, Odette Osantowski, Jeanette Brooks, Mary Freedman, and I met in Mary's awesome sewing room one morning in March and assembled the top.

Jay Seidel in San Juan, using his computerized long arm quilting machine, performed some true magic and brought the top to life.

The quilt then traveled to Maggie Bell's where the Mini Maniacs friendship group and others began the hand quilting. Charlotte Runyan held a second quilting bee and added more stitching to it during the following week. Karen Wendel held a third bee. And I held a fourth bee for those members who live in San Diego County. Thank you, everyone, who added or will add your hand stitching.

Holly Betz has volunteered to bind the quilt and sew on a sleeve using fabric that Marcia Kuehl picked up at Quilt Passions. Then I'll sew on a label and finish whatever is left. Marcia also volunteered to make coasters—for wine glasses of course—with a few left over blocks and backing fabric.

This was a BIG JOB and I could not have done it without LOTS of help. Thank you everyone, I'm truly grateful...and now appreciate my own President's quilt all the more.



2024-2025 Block of the Month "OH MY STARS"

We are creating a star studded Irish chain quilt for BOM 24-25. The patterns would adapt well to a holiday theme, or limited color palette. The nine blocks (12" finished) will be combined with sashing to finish at 44" square. An additional border can be added for a 48" square.

The star blocks are **Moda Blockheads 5** patterns. You can join a Facebook group (Moda Blockheads 5) to see posts of multiple fabric options of finished blocks for inspiration.

Fabric requirements:

1 1/2 yard background fabric for blocks and sashing 3/4 yard print for chain and border Assorted fat quarters or scraps for the stars





Piecing Instructions

Step 1

On the wrong side of each C square, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.

Place B and C squares right sides together. Stitch a scant ¼" seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square apart on the line to yield 2 HSTs, and press the seams to the darker triangles (B).

On the wrong side of one HST, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.

Place both HSTs right sides together with the contrasting (B) triangles on opposite sides. Stitch a scant ¼" seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square apart on the line to yield 2 QSTs, and press the seams to one side (or open).

Repeat to make 8 B/C QSTs.

Trim QSTs

3 1/2" block).


Step 2

Align the diagonal cut edges of two E triangles with opposite sides of the D square as shown,

Stitch a scant ¼" seam along each edge, and press the seams to the triangles (E).

Repeat with the remaining E triangles on the remaining opposite sides of the D square to make a square-in-a-square unit.








Lay out QST units, square-in-a-square unit, and 4 A squares as shown.

acknowledging the challenges and sorrows of our Guild members and also their celebrations.


